

#### Minutes:

Club registration : Peter Vibert posted a listing of 271 vehicles that had been 'Red Plate' registered in the past year or so. The listing, displayed on the notice board, has highlighted a few vehicles for which he has not received registration renewal details. Presumably these are either registered by some other means, sold or off the road. Members were asked to check that vehicles they have registered through the club are properly designated.



Up to 150 cars are expected to attend this national rally in April next year. There will be a big display at the Vic Park Lake for the public to see them all.


